The property must be subdivided before any more water taps are allowed on the property. The ordinance went into effect in February 2020. The mobile home was moved onto the property in December 2020. Ahold was put in on water meters in January 2020 until the city comes into TCEQ compliance for the city's number of meters. Mr. Brocington never established service with an \$800.00 tap fee. Once the property owner subdivides the property, then a water tap will be able to be installed.

A motion was made by Councilmember Eva Alexander and second by Councilmember Robert Kalka approving the 2020 tax roll as submitted by Cherokee County Appraisal District. The tax roll shows a projected collection of \$81,679.48 for the 2020 tax year. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Councilmember Robert Klaka and second by Councilmember Billie Petty to table the Golf Cart Ordinance requested by Councilmember Clint Smith until the December 2020 meeting. Motion carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Councilmember Robert Kalka and second by Councilmember Billie Petty to pay the monthly bills. Motion carried unanimously.

The October 2020 budget comparisons for the General Fund and the Water and Sewer Fund were discussed. No action was taken as this is a discussion item only.

Department Reports:

Water and Sewer - Carl Pennington and Roy Shanks presented the council with the utility system reports.

Both plants are running well. A new chlorine scale is needed at the sewer plant and will be ordered this week. Roy Shanks is almost ready to test for his license, Mr. Pennington has dropped his contact fee down to the minimum, Roy is taking care of the daily reports, and Carl is not having to be here every day. The sewer plant grant work will start at the first of the year, and the new rake will be sent off the be galvanized as soon as it is completely rebuilt.

Police Department: Chief Harold Rapsilver was not able to attend the meeting; Officer Steve Cooper presented the council with the police department reports.

The police department served 126 hotdogs for the 2nd annual Halloween event. The community turned out and had a great time.

The council would like to discuss another full-time officer at the December 2020 council meeting.
