

We also need your help to make our next emergency event run smoothly. As a rental property owner in the City of Wells, your rental property must be following the rules & regulations listed below.

- 1. Each landlord should be subscribed to our mass text/email system; this requires a cell phone or an email address. If you do not have a cell phone or email, ask a close family member to sign up for you; this way, you are alerted to what is happening with your service. You only have to sign up once, but you should sign up again if your contact information changes. Visit https://cityofwells.us/subscribe or call city hall and have them sign you up.
- 2. Each metered property owner must have a personal working shut-off on the water service line between the dwelling and water meter.

 Effective March 1, 2021, when a request is made to turn off a meter due to a leak or weather conditions, the city employee will not turn the meter on until a working shut-off is installed. Test your shut-off today to make sure it is in working order, and if you do not have a personal shut off install one as soon as possible.
 - **Water meters are the City of Wells property and are not to be turned on or off by anyone other than a city employee. Anyone turning the city meter off will be responsible for any damage done to the meter and meter shut off.
- 3. Correct 911 Addressing is required for all dwellings inside the city limits of Wells. In 2020 the City of Wells mailed 911 address letters to every property owner. This 911 Address can also be obtained from city hall and is listed on all water bills.
 - We still have many dwellings that do not have 911 address numbers visible on their homes or have the wrong 911 address posted. If you have taken care of this, "Thank you." If you have not taken care of posting your 911 address, please do so today. Our Police, Fire, and EMS workers can't find you if your 911 address isn't posted correctly.
